


### **YOUNG LAWYERS DIVISION - TOY DRIVE**

### **MEMBER SPOTLIGHT**





### Judge Randell H. Rowe, III

I am a 5th-generation Floridian originally from the panhandle town of Madison where I grew up and attended Madison High School. In 1983 I graduated in the centennial class of Stetson University with a Bachelor of Business Administration degree in Finance. Thereafter, I received my law degree from the Cumberland School of Law of Samford University in Birmingham, Alabama.

Following law school, I returned to Volusia County and began my legal career as the first judicial staff attorney hired for the Seventh Judicial Circuit. Chief Judge Kim C. Hammond offered me the job, and I was assigned to work with him in Flagler and Volusia Counties. It was a great learning experience and Judge Hammond proved to be a true mentor and role model to me. I knew that I wanted to become a judge someday after my law clerk experience.

My next legal job was as an assistant county attorney for Volusia County. After 12 years in that position, in December of 2005 I was appointed by Governor Jeb Bush to fill a newly created circuit judge position in Volusia County. Subsequently, I was elected and then twice re-elected unopposed and have been a circuit judge for 19 years now. I have spent most of that time presiding over civil and criminal divisions. Following the retirement of Judge Jim Clayton earlier this year, I became the most senior judge in the Seventh Judicial Circuit. The time has really flown by! I remind my colleagues that, while I may be the most senior judge now, I am not the oldest judge around – yet!

For the entire time I have been a judge, I've a member of the Volusia County Law Library Board of Trustees, the Dunn-Blount American Inn of Court, and the DeLand Rotary Club. I am a former officer and director of the Volusia County Bar Association and a two-term past president of the Flagler County Bar Association.

Concerning the "favorite local restaurant" question, I like any place that has good lasagna or a great rib-eye steak. However, I would have to say that I frequent Tom's Pizza the most because it's next door to the DeLand courthouse and is the preferred lunch place for many of the judges there.

As for my career choice if not in the legal profession, I would say that I probably would have used my business degree and sought a position in the corporate world. Maybe it's not too late for that if I decide to retire soon! Chances are, though, upon retirement I most likely will spend my time traveling and pursuing my gardening hobby.

Something not known about me, I make awesome homemade chocolate milkshakes! Also, that I spend a fair amount of weekend time managing my family-owned timber LLC.

**Notice: Judge Foxman has retired effective November 29** to focus on his health. "Judge Foxman has been a great friend to me personally and to many of my colleagues on the bench," Chief Judge Leah Case said in a news release. Judge Foxman was admitted to The Florida Bar in 1999 and elected to a circuit judgeship in 2010. He was reelected in 2016 and 2022 without opposition. Foxman served in the Family Law and Felony divisions in Volusia and Flagler counties. Before joining the court, Foxman was an assistant state attorney. Foxman's seat will be filled by gubernatorial appointment.

#### **Jeffrey Bigman**

Born and raised in Brooklyn, New York, Bigman says "You can take the boy out of Brooklyn, but you can't take the Brooklyn out of the boy." While Brooklyn shaped much of his character, it didn't dictate his sports allegiance—he's a proud Yankees fan, steering clear of the Mets, Giants, or Dodgers.

After graduating from Queens College of the City University of New York in 1980, he pursued his legal education at Fordham University School of Law, earning his degree in 1983. His career began on Wall Street in Commercial Litigation, where he quickly honed his skills as a trial attorney. Over the next 12 years in New York,

he developed a specialization in defending medical malpractice actions and disciplinary matters for healthcare providers.

In 1996, he relocated to Florida, expanding his practice to include a broader array of insurance defense and civil trial work. Today, he is a Board-Certified Civil Trial Lawyer, representing clients in Insurance Defense, injury actions, and product liability cases. His reputation for excellence is built on a foundation of integrity, a value instilled early on by his New York mentors. Their guidance helped him achieve the distinction of becoming one of the youngest partners at the largest insurance defense firm in the country in 1990.

In Florida, his career was further shaped by his partnership with the recently retired Judge Terence Perkins. Working alongside Perkins at what is now Smith Bigman Brock, he gained invaluable insight into balancing zealous advocacy with professionalism—qualities he continues to exemplify.

When he isn't preparing for trial, he enjoys dining at local favorites like 63 Sovereign and L'angolo in Or-

mond Beach. However, he may argue that his home kitchen is the best spot in town, as he cooks most evenings when he isn't immersed in case preparation.

If he weren't practicing law, his dream career would involve pitching for the Yankees—or at least announcing or writing about them. His passion for baseball extends beyond spectating; he's a nearexpert in Fantasy Baseball, a game he has been mastering since 1988.

#### **CITY OF PORT ORANGE ASSISTANT CITY ATTORNEY**

Conveniently located on the east coast of Florida between Daytona Beach and New Smyrna Beach, the City of Port Orange is a vibrant, up-and-coming community and home to 66,000 residents. Covering 29 square miles, Port Orange is a moderately sized city in Volusia County with waterfront property lining the intracoastal waterway. Port Orange is accessible via I-95 and US-1. The City operates under a Council-Manager form of government.



Under the general direction of the City Attorney, the Assistant City Attorney provides comprehensive support to department heads on routine matters to protect the interests of the City. The Assistant City Attorney will also assist the City Attorney on complex research tasks and occasional civil litigation.

Port Orange seeks candidates who have the ability to work well with the City Attorney's legal team and can earn the trust and respect of the City's management team. A Juris Doctor Degree from an accredited law school preferably with three years or more of experience as a practicing attorney and a substantial amount of which has been in the practice of local government law, or other relevant experience in the government or private sector. The selected candidate must be an attorney eligible to practice law in Florida with an active Florida Bar license and in good standing with the Florida Bar at the time of appointment.

The City of Port Orange offers a competitive starting salary range of \$96,000 - \$115,000 depending upon qualifications and experience. 
